A tribute to the spirit of the Orphéon jazz club, once located beside the first Diptyque boutique at 34 Boulevard Saint-Germain, where the Maison's founders would gather.

This immersive experience invites visitors to relive that vibrant era and explore the richness and rhythms of jazz.

Take a seat at one of the self-service turntables, grab a pair of headphones, and let the music tell its story. At the heart of the room, forty carefully curated vinyl records await - an eclectic collection of timeless classics, contemporary blends, and hidden gems.

To continue the journey, discover a selection of album covers and books dedicated to the history of jazz. A playful nod to Orphéon's spirit also comes alive through dedicated games scattered throughout the space.


